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to know Robert Easton of Romney Hall in the County of Westernland. I am owner of Virginia and father as my substitute property off in the many negroes that the slaves whose number, names, situations kept will fully appear by a schedule herunto annexed: And whereas these for some time past have conceived that to retain them in Slavery is contrary to the true principles of Religion Justice, that therefore it was my duty to maintain them, if it could be accomplished without infringing the laws of my Country, without being of disadvantage to my neighbours the Community at large: and whereas the General Assembly for the Commencement of Virginia did in the year seventeen hundred eighty two enact a law entitled "an Act to authorize the emancipation of Slaves" that he'll remember that the said Robert do under the said Act for myself my heirs Executors Administrators emancipate from Slavery all such my slaves emancipated in the aforesaid schedule (save one under the age of forty six years) but in a manner from as hereafter particularly mentioned that forth, that is to say: that for as much as these with great care Patience and concern to discover that made of them from Slavery which can be effected convenient to have with the least possible disadvantage to my fellow Citizens these have returned to discharge myself from this Act of justice & duty by declaring that my Slaves not receive an immediate but a gradual emancipation in the following manner - viz - Of ten of my slaves under the age of forty six beginning at the eldest descending according to their age are hereby emancipated that free on the second day of January seventeen hundred ninety two: and fifteen more of my Slaves shall be liberate that free on the first day of January seventeen hundred ninety three: and annually in every year upon the first day of January (until when that happens on a Sunday then on the next succeeding day) until the year eighteen hundred three inclusive
